

## The least advantaged Albertan youth were strongly over-represented in Government of Alberta services



2,281 least advantaged Albertan youth 12 to 17 years old were identified. Advantage was defined in terms of educational achievement, mental health, and socio-economic status in 2008/09.

The least advantaged youth represented only 1.1% of the population of 12 to 17 year olds, but a much larger proportions of the youth receiving maltreatment-related intervention services, Family Support for Children with Disabilities, corrections, and offence charges.
